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A CHAT WITH THE CEO

Aadwika: According to you, what would be the ideal school environment and how would you foster that kind of culture?

CEO: I think the ideal school environment means that the children and staff should be very happy. Children should look forward to coming to school and feel proud of their school.

Jaiditya: What are the most important characteristics of an effective school?

CEO: The learning needs to take place all the time. Learning does not simply mean the text book learning or learning only in the classroom. When you come to a school, you learn the values which remain in you throughout your life. Students should learn manners, etiquettes & behavior. Students need to feel really proud of their school. In ordinary school, one learns only subjects but in a great school you learn values which remain with you life-long.



Alia: What according to you is an ideal classroom environment?

CEO: The classroom needs to be interactive. Students should take part in various discussions and remain active. Teaching-Learning is not a spectator's sports. Students need to interact and ask questions.

Aadwika: From your view point what should be the role of technology in the process of education?

CEO: Technology has become an integral part of education. You can't separate it. However, too much use of technology doesn't help utilizing one's capacity to the maximum. Therefore, technology should be used as an enchanter.

Alia: What role does exam play in the field of education?

CEO: Examinations are means of evaluation or a kind of check point which plays an important role to know how much a student has learned. Exams assess whether the minimum standard has been achieved. Like a car that needs to be taken occasionally to a garage to assess everything is fine or not, exam helps to assess the knowledge and learning of a student. Exam is also important because it determines the pattern of teaching/pedagogy.

Aadwika: How would the NEP 2019 enhance our education system?

CEO: National Education Policy 2019 aims to universalize the pre-primary education by 2025. It proposes new Curricular and Pedagogical Structure, with 5+3+3+4 design covering the children in the age group 3-18 years. Under this, Pre-Primary & Grades 1-2 is considered as Foundational Stage; Grades 3-5 as Preparatory Stage; Grades 6-8 as Middle Stage and Grades 9-12 as Secondary Stage.

Research shows that human brain can learn more languages at a young age. So the proposal is that more languages are to be taught at pre-primary level with a mathematics foundation. Research based, innovative & creativity kind of curriculum has been proposed for the Foundation Level. NEP 2019 planned an integrated 4 years teachers training program called Bachelor of Education. These are the major highlights which will be introduced with effect from 2020.

Jaiditya: Do you think firm discipline is important in a school?

CEO: When you talk about discipline, the general concept is to stand in a queue, to be quiet in a classroom etc, but discipline is not that. It is orderliness, something that you do in order. Not just in school, you need to maintain a high order of discipline at home and personal life. If an adult is disciplined that means he/she is balanced. For instance, if you get a pocket money of Rs.200 you have to think how you will manage your expenses the entire month with it. An in disciplined person will blow away the entire amount within two/three days whereas a disciplined person would be accountable. Discipline is orderliness and a state of balance that needs to be maintained through dialogue and discussion and not by force.

Alia: What is your fondest memory of your own school life?

CEO: Friends, lot of good friends and lot of games and sports, like soccer, athletics, volleyball, tennis and various other sports that I had played, I don't have lots of good memories of studies. I was very fond of all extra-curricular activities in school but not studies, I actually studied for real after I left my school, rather after I left my college. I cannot afford to play anymore but I can still study and expand my horizon.

Aadwika: What was your favourite subject in school and which subject you hated the most?

CEO: Till class VIII I didn't have any favourite subject. Then one day I went to a teacher who was my science teacher and was very passionate about Life Science i.e. Biology. That was the time I fell in love with this subject. That happened because of the teacher. This happened when I was in class IX, and I did well, I did well in X as well. Then I decided to opt for Biology along with Maths. So, I studied Physics, Chemistry, Biology and Maths. Then I did my Honours in Zoology. Afterwards I did my masters in Environmental Science. So, of course I can say that my favourite subject is Life Science. As for hating a subject, I would say, I did not hate, but I started disliking Maths. That too happened because of my teacher, as he could not make Maths easy and palatable for me. So I was always scared of Maths. Though I got 98% in Maths in class X, but I didn't enjoy Maths. I would say that was because of the fear towards that subject which was created by my teacher.

Jaiditya: What are the three most important goals that you want our school to reach?

CEO: The three important goals that I want our school to reach are, in number one I would place happiness among the students. Second, I want my students to be self-responsible and accountable because if they are self-responsible, everything can be taken care of. Third, is academic excellence, because academics is the bottom line of any good school. Everybody ultimately comes to school to get good marks. In life academic excellence plays a key role. Where ever you go, people will ask you about your marks and grades. So, it is important for a child to be happy in his/her school environment, only then he/she will become responsible, will complete his class work, home work etc. If these two things happen, academic excellence will happen automatically and naturally.

Alia: What was your main motive behind introducing Cambridge Curriculum in RPS?

CEO: "Cambridge" has become synonymous with quality education. I started working with Cambridge Curriculum (CIE) long back, some times in the 90s. So now it has been 30 years or so. I feel that every day, every moment the curriculum is challenging. There is no chance of rote learning. One needs to understand what is taught, apply and think that really helps your cognitive domain to develop. You train your brain cells and when your cognitive domain develops. Your other domain also gets exposed by various activities. You not only do well in academics, you do well in everything in life, be it sports, music or anything. In 21st century there would be demand of workforce that can really think because repetitive work will be done totally by machines. Human beings will not be required to do them. In the years to come, repetitive work will not get valued. Work which needs to be done by applying knowledge will be valued. In the days to come people would not be required to just have skills, they should have a high level of competencies. The knowledge will be required to be applied developing the application, critical thinking & problem solving. The Cambridge curriculum caters to all this, preparing the students for the challenges of the 21st century.

Aadwika: How do you involve students in the decision-making process?

CEO: It is very important to learn to make decisions or choice at a young age, how to express yourself, how to take things with responsibility. Every school has a system to forming a Prefectorial Body, but that's just for namesake. Students just get badges they get decorated sashes etc. When asked about their duties they would respond "I maintain discipline" as they stand in an allotted place during dispersal time. Thus, students do not get a chance to take decisions. But the idea behind the formation of Prefect Council is to give them a chance to become leaders. It is a pathway to develop leaders. So when we offer you the opportunity to become a part of the Sports committee of the school or the school magazine committee, you need to start taking responsibility and perform. When you start doing that, you become a part of the decision-making process. In most of the schools the decision-making power lies only in the hands of the school Principal. People have to accept his/her decisions whether they are right or wrong. But in our school this does not happen. Our decision-making process is decentralized. Here we empower the person related to a particular department of work to take the decision. The beginning of this process can be done by entrusting students with some small yet important responsibilities like switching on or off the lights, fans and ACs after class, helping the teachers to take the attendance of bus commuters etc. These responsibilities at a young age help everyone to take correct decisions. This leads to developing confidence. Any organization where the decision-making power lies solely in one hand, such organization becomes ineffective. Here, in our school everybody has the power to take decisions, and we support them.



The School Management congratulated all the students and the faculty for their excellent performance in the CBSE Senior School Certificate Examination.


